ALPHA COURSE

Dear All,

On January 31st and for Tuesday evenings (usually) over the following few weeks, we are hoping to hold an Alpha Course.

This will be aimed at the whole congregation but with the hope those of you newer members of the congregation might like to attend and learn a little more about the Christian faith. Such things as baby-sitting and partners 'taking turns' week by week to attend can be made.

We also ask members of the congregation to invite friends and neighbours and, indeed, we will publicise within the parish generally in due course.

In order for this to work, we will need members of the congregation to help out. The more that help, the fewer weeks they might need to be available (unless they want to, of course). It is entirely possible for helpers to also participate in the course.

The evening has a simple format.

Start - possibly 7pm

Arrive, welcome, hospitality - light meal (sandwiches, soup possibly, fruit, teas & coffees)

Short video

Short talk

Discussion in small groups

Depart

I have booked the hall for the relevant dates.

So we will need:

Volunteers to prepare the food and serve/tidy up. The intention, as you can see above, would be very much to keep things as simple as possible. Not least so that hospitality teams can join in the evening if they wish to.

Volunteers to set up.

Volunteers to facilitate the discussions. This is simply to ensure that everybody gets to express themselves following the video and talk and to ask whatever questions they wish. The Group will answer those questions among themselves the facilitator Does Not Need to have a Doctorate in Contemporary Christian Theology. They just need to facilitate the discussion. Training will be given but, essentially, it's a case of allowing people to speak and people to discuss the questions raised among themselves.

I imagine that six or so people in each of the 'teams': hospitality, set up, discussion facilitators. Although, the facilitators might need to be there most weeks, the other two teams could work in shifts of two per week.

Would you please respond to me directly if you were interested in any of the following, please?

- a) attending
- b) inviting someone to accompany you
- c) hospitality team
- d) set up team
- e) discussion facilitator team.

Once I get an idea of who might be able to come/help, we can make a final decision on whether to go ahead.
